## ONE SEAM FLYING GEESE



There are a numerous ways to make Geese, old traditional way is to cut out triangles, match up the bias edges and sew.

Here is one of the new way .

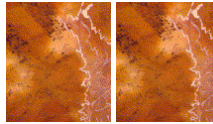
I like it the most because it has one seam and no bias.

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### Cutting Pieces

- 2 3 ½ inch squares for the brown
  - 1 3 ½ inch x 5 ½ inch rectangle - your choice
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Lay out the 3 ½ " squares side by side.

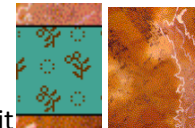


These will be the two side pieces.

Next fold the rectangle in half with right side of fabric out.



With the fold facing the top place on the right 3 ½ " square centering it, flip the other square on top of the folded piece. Now you have your sandwich, sew a ¼ " seam on the vertical side the sandwich .



Open up the sandwich, and see the middle flap. Take the flap and open it to the point, spreading out the bottom to the outside corners, Press. Trim from the top point to a ¼ inch seam allowance, Measure your ruler 2.5 inches from the center to edge and rim extra away, repeat for oppsite side. Block size with seam allowance is 3 ¼ x 5 inches.

I didn't cut the center back out, you can if you wish. Sew them for another quilt piece.
