Lastly, Gerry asked the board to approve having classes at "A Quilting Place" because the lighting is so much better than at the hotel. After some discussion, that request was approved.

Quilt Show – The board discussed with Lorraine their expectations for her as the featured quilter at this year's show. Nancy announced that she has 172 entries

for the quilt show. (119 of these quilts are small quilts.) The board discussed hanging, rooms needed, setup, the time of the drawing for the Opportunity Quilt, and the date for next year.

Bus Trip – The bus trip is planned for Saturday, October 4 and will take members to the AQS Show is Des Moines, Iowa. Mary informed the board that the price has gone up and it will be more economical if we can fill the 56 passenger bus. After a short discussion, the board approved this request.

Webmaster – Roberta reported that the transition work on the website is about two-thirds complete. She detailed a number of items that have been completed and other items yet to be finished. Roberta noted that a "webstitcher" is still needed. After a short discussion, Corinne agreed to fill this position.

Small Groups – Katie will greet new members in May and work on getting small groups to be ambassadors for the meetings next year.

Tammy moved to adjourn. Roberta seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned.

According to Nancy, quilt numbers will be emailed to members by the end of next week. Volunteers are still needed for a variety of jobs. CD's will be available after the show. Thanks to all who have already donated to the small quilt auction. More items are needed. Scissor-sharpening and quilt appraisals will be available at the show along with about 35 vendors. There has been a slight change in the turn-in time. Quilts may be turned in to Mary Dudzinski (3505 South 105^{th} Street) on Wednesday, June 11 from 6 – 8 p.m. and on Thursday or Friday from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. Quilts may also be turned

in at More Sew For You on Friday from 2 - 5 p.m. and on Saturday from 1 - 4 p.m. Members will receive a receipt when quilts are turned in. This receipt must be presented in order to pick quilts up from the show on Saturday, June 21.

Block Exchange – There was one winner for the set of blocks turned in this evening. A winner was also chosen for the quilt that was displayed all year. Anyone who is interested in helping to plan next year's block exchange was invited to a planning meeting on July 8 at the Village Inn at 108th and L Streets at 1:30 p.m.

Membership – A new membership chair is needed since Tammy will be taking on the duties of quilt show chairman next year. A number of door prizes were awarded from the following shops: More Sew For You, Bela Fiore, The Quilt Studio, Sew Creative and JoAnne's.
