Spring Fling: Angella Arndt asked member who are attending the retreat to check for her email and let her know that they received the information she sent out. The retreat will be held February 13–15, 2015 at the Archdiocesan Conference Center. Check in is 4 p.m.

Quilts of Valor: Mary Zagozda and Kerby Selmer asked for help at their sew-ins. They meet on the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of each month at Jackie Heyne's shop, A Quilting Place. Their next sew-in will be on February 28.

Quilt Show: Tammy Magill informed members that the next meeting will be held next Tuesday, February 17, at St. Paul's Methodist Church at 7 p.m. Tammy was pleased to announce that the web pages for the quilt show are up and running. The quilt submission form and vendor forms are both available. She reminded members that the theme is "Quilting is a Work of Art." Janelle Reed is in charge of decorations. Members may donate items.
