So please mark your calendars and make plans. All the final information will be on the website and in the newsletter in February. The Greater Kansas City Shop Hop will also be that weekend, in case you want to come in a day early and participate.

**We are starting a new concept with this newsletter.** When Heartland Quilt Network was formed, quilt shop owners were some of the founding members. But over the years, it has seemed to help the quilt teachers/speakers and quilt guilds more than the professionals who are not teachers/speakers. So the Board came up with a plan. This November newsletter had no special focus in the past. **We are going to start featuring the quilt shops, vendors, retreat places, tour groups, etc. in the November issue of the newsletter.** This will give them a venue to advertise their specific quilt connection. You can connect to their links that give more specific information about them. Let us know what you think of this. We are excited and hopeful that this will benefit them more.

**Has your guild chosen a permanent contact person?** This person needs to be willing to receive the newsletter and any email information that comes from HQN. We also ask the person to pass along the information to their guild in a timely manner. One of the best ways to do that is to **send the newsletter out over email if your guild does that.** You would have to ask the newsletter editor of your guild to help. But again, this is another way to get our message out to many more people. HQN is 15 years old, and we still find people everyday who have never heard of us. Our job as members is to help pass the word along to others. **To be the permanent contact person, you need to have an email address and be willing to stay with this job for a few years.** You need to let HQN know when you have new officers; keep current with HQN dues; and any other changes with your guild.

One of our biggest problems we have is that guild officers use our services but forget to tell the next group of officers. It is hoped that if the guild has a permanent contact person, that person will be an advocate for HQN and keep the guild informed about what is happening.

Anyway, someone sitting near you will probably have anything you don't have and really need.
2. **If the class calls for a sewing machine, don't take the time to test it's capabilities.** Heck, you can try it out when you're there. It's also great to know that there is a professional instructor who can take class time to set it up for you.
3. **If the instructor is offering a book or pattern for the class, don't buy it.** You can surely take good enough notes to continue the project at home, and the instructor is probably overpaid anyway. It's not really cheating to copy someone else's pattern, is it?
4. **Bring your children/grandchildren.** Everyone

adores kids, right?

5. **Cell phones on at ALL TIMES!** It's no distraction to the rest of the class or instructor, and everyone else really wants to hear the minute details of your life.
