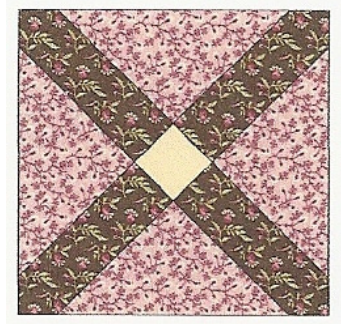
## Album Block Pattern



48 X 84 Cot Quilt

### Fabric:

Civil War Reproduction fabric is requested  
 You will need 2 contrasting/coordinating fabrics  
 1 - 2 5/8" square of fabric for signature block  
 (this should be tone on tone or something with not much design, so writing will show)



12 1/2" Block

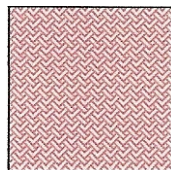
### For one block you will need:

- 1 - 11" square of fabric #1
- 1 - 9" X 12" piece of fabric #2
- 1 - 2 5/8" for center signature square (2 fat quarters will make 2 blocks)

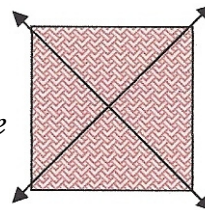
### Cutting Directions:

#### Fabric #1

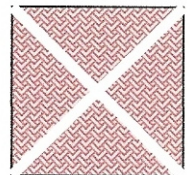
Cut 1 - 11" square



Sub-cut the square on the diagonal twice

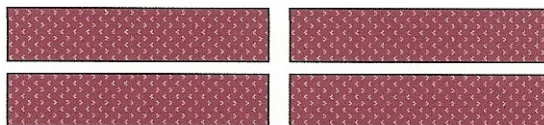


after cutting, you will have 4 bias  
Cut triangles



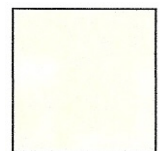
#### Fabric #2

Cut 4 - 2 5/8" X 9" Rectangles



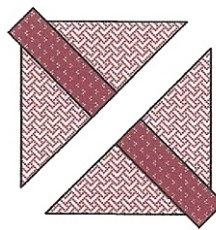
#### Fabric #3

Cut 1 2 5/8" square for Signature Block



### Piecing the Block:

The block is made from 3 Units as shown  
 Saw all seams are a scant 1/4"  
 Be careful not to stretch the bias edges.

### For Unit #1 you will need:

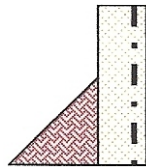
- 2 triangles of Fabric #1
- 1 - 2 5/8" X 9" strip of fabric #2



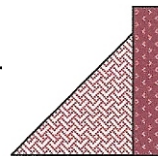
Arrange as shown

*Album Block Continued*

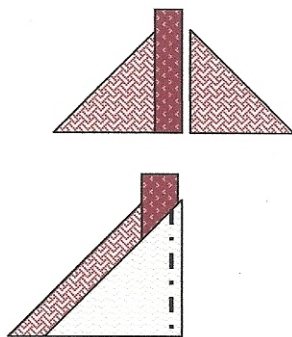
*Lay the strip of fabric #2 over the triangle of fabric #1, with right sides together  
Line up bottom edges, the top of the fabric strip will extend beyond the tip of the triangle.*



*Stitch pieces together  
Press seams toward the triangle*

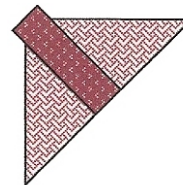


*Arrange the section that you just completed with the remaining bias triangles*



*Place the fabric #1, triangle right side down over the outer edge of fabric #2 strip  
Aligning the bottom edges (this is very important in order for corner seams to match, in the final steps of block construction) sew together.*

*Press seam towards triangle. Unit 1 is now complete the strip will extend beyond the edge of the triangles. **Do Not Trim!***



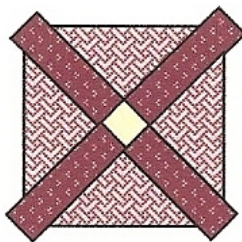
*Repeat the above steps to make Unit 2.*

**Unit 3**

*Sew the remaining 2 - fabric #2 rectangular strips to each side of the signature square and press the seams toward the square.*

**Completing the block:**

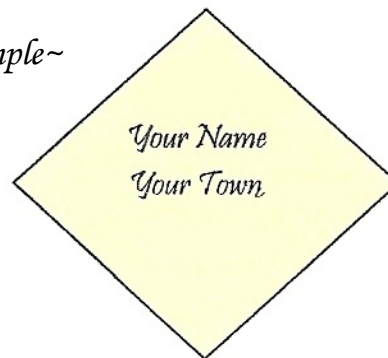
*Matching seams, lay Unit 3 over Unit 1 with right sides together, sew.  
Press seam away from Unit 3  
Matching seams, sew Unit 2 to Unit 3,  
Press seam away from Unit 3*



**Do Not Trim!**  
*The blocks will be trimmed to size when they are ready to be sewn together.*

*To sign your block, stabilize the fabric for signing by ironing freezer paper on the wrong side.  
Use a #.05 - Pigma Micron pen to write a personal message of comfort or support and sign your name and hometown.  
Don't forget to remove paper after signing the block,*

**Remember**, please nothing political or religious.  
*When the quilt is completed the label is dated, so please do not date your block,*
