### **April Speaker**

Karen Ruwe has been quilting since 1983 when she took her first class from Sara Dillow and Jean Gauseman.

Karen has worked in a quilt shop for 7 years and has taught classes there. She then taught retreats and presented trunk shows for the last 10 years. Karen enjoys teaching and learning with quilters; retreats are a great way to share. After all that's what it is all about. She has won several awards with her design jackets and art quilts. Karen will be presenting a truck show of her work during the April meeting.

Karen's two-day class will be like a miniretreat! She will provide the pattern and instructions for creating a beautiful sampler of threedimensional flowers. Techniques include using fusible web between two layers of fabric and various folding and stitching to create realistic depth. Then you will explore the various stitches (you know, those ones you never knew what we for) on your sewing machine to

#### Shhhhh!!! It's a secret.....

#### Let's make Nine Patch blocks for our outgoing President, Jackie Hyne.

Each year the members of OQG present their outgoing President with blocks for a quilt at the May meeting. According to the OQG quilting elves, Jackie enjoys "scrappy quilts". Soooo lets make some 9 patch blocks for Jackie. Dig into your stash and pull out 2 pieces of fabrics. A light and dark or medium and dark combination. According to the elves, Jackie does not care for floral fabrics so please don't pull any floral fabric.



Each square within the Nine Patch clock needs to be cut 3 1/2" by 3 1/2"

The unfinished size of the block is 9 1/2 " by 9 1/2", finished is 9" x 9"

**Don't forget to sign your block!** You can drop off the blocks at the April and May meetings in a basket located on a table near the membership table.

## OQG Board Meeting Minutes Tuesday, March 3, 2009

President Jackie Heyne opened the meeting at 7PM with fifteen members present and asked for committee reports.

Carla Toczek Quilt Show Chair and Susie Jarosz Co-chair gave announcements on the Quilt Show. They are as follows: Jean at Bernina said a \$150 Gift Certificate would be the Grand Prize for Best of Show, Nancy Kirk would do Lectures instead of a booth payment, but we will ask if she would appraise the Raffle Quilt for the 2010 quilt show, Jan Carlin would be in charge of food, Placing an ad in the Country Register, Wednesday night has not been resolved yet, and a flyer was pasted around the table for viewing. Judy Sellers Vendor Co-Ordinate reported that she has 29 vendors, asked about parking for one who needs a place for an RV, electric outlets are still an issue and her list for the vendor set up committee needs to be done by March 15th.

Properties Andy Chakravarti said the frames will be ready and that a truck for picking them up at storage is arranged, she just needs volunteers to be ready to load and unload.

Rita Mathews of Helping Hands asked that we qualify the difference between Utility quilts, which Helping Hands is to handle and the Community Outreach quilts that Jan Fry of Quilts for a Cause will be handling. She also inquired about the Demo area that Helping Hands was asked to set up for members who may wish to help make a charity quilt.

Vice President/ Programs Chair LaVonne Dunetts has 18 members signed up for Sandy McMillan's Saturday quilting class and 20 for Sundays appliqué class. She will be accepting signups and payments for the April class at the March meeting. Karen Ruwe of Arlington will be April's speaker and will be having a twoday class on "My Secret Garden". May's speaker will be Ruth Ciemnoczolowski.

Historian Lorraine Fitz-

gerald has filled all the albums that were available and is now using three ring binders to put the pictures in. She has all the pictures filed to date.

Membership chair Carol Nish needs help with data entry. Bev Adams will not be able to do it. Vicki Hoskovic who is nominated for the 2010 President Elect position and present at the meeting volunteered to do the data entry.

Dee Acklie of Campwannamakablankie said that the forms are ready to be filled out, but members should not send them to LeAnne Killion yet, she is not at home.

Jan Fry, Quilts for a Cause Chair announced that she was approached about the new Quilters productions being put on by the Omaha Community Players. This is their 85th season and several key people with the local quilt guilds are involved. There will be a group meeting every Saturday to get the list of quilts ready for them by August. The production will be running 8/21 to 9/27. Jan will make a formal announcement at the March meeting. All guild members are asked to participate in this huge undertaking.

President Elect Kathy Havranek made a motion for the Guild Board to give a check of \$2000 to help sponsor the Event. Vice President/Programs Chair LaVonne Dunetts second the motion. The approved Board the \$2000 check and possibly added monetary help for other props needed for the production. Kathy also asked that outgoing Committees be reminded that they need to prepare their outgoing reports for the changeover meeting.

Treasurer Joan Workman has updated the Quicken file to the 2006 version for the new treasurer.

President Jackie Heyne adjourned the meeting at 8:30PM.

### OQG Meeting Minutes Tuesday, March 10, 2009

Sandi will be taking some time off from speaking to focus on making quilts and husband Sam.

President Jackie then called for Committee Chairs to come forward.

LaVonne Dunetts announced that Karen Ruwe of Arlington would be the April Speaker and there are still openings in her two-day class. Books from Jean Mills were in the back of the room for pickup. Two Concur Cancer representatives brought information on making pillowcases and would be available for questions. Then she finished by throwing two Challenge fat quarters to

the members.

The Quilt Show Committee started with Connie Sorensen explaining the boxes on the internet sign up, telling the printing of Barb Van Trumps address was incorrect and the house number is 4420 and finished with asking members to stop by the table to signup for volunteer times that were still open. Chair Carla Toczek and Co-chair Susie Jarosz announced thev had bookmarks to be picked up by members and brought to locations for advertising the show. Nancy Kirk needs scribes for her appraisals and to contact her personally, April is the dead line and Drop off is end of May. Cindy Erickson had a demo of where to put the quilt label, bottom left on the back of the quilt. Put the number square over top of the label and the number should cover the square so it can be seen. She also asked that the Camp Wannamakablankie forms not be sent to LeAnne in Kearney until after April 20th since she won't be at her home before then.

Denvia Capozio and Rojene Grigg of Block exchange gave out two sets to winners Nancy Mills and Janet Koch. Carol Nish reminded everyone to send the thank cards attached to the door prizes. Announced we had six guests and that tonight was the last night to give her guild dues for this year and that at next months meeting the dues collected would be for the 2009-2010 year. Fifteen door prizes were given out. Angie Reed Chair of Helping Hands had seventeen quilts turned in and still had eleven kits for members to pick up and finish. The Omaha Quilters Guild will be presenting the Playhouse with a \$2000 check and hopes to help with other needs as they come up.
