## 2010 Quilt Show Challenge

# What's Black and White and Red all over?

A newspaper! And what fills a newspaper? Words!

In a play on our 2010 theme: *Spoken Without a Word*, we challenge the OQG members to speak WITH a word.

#### **Rules of the game:**

1. Choose a word with meaning in your life (or notit could be random!) and then design the word into your entry.

a. The word may be pieced, appliquéd, embroidered, or quilted, but MUST be clearly visible to judge and audience. \*\*Paint and ink excluded. Word **must** be sewn in some fashion.

b. Word must appear at least once.

c. Word must be decent. (no R-rating) The quilt show committee reserves the right to reject an entry deemed inappropriate to general audiences. We wish to challenge creativity, not community standards.

2. You must include a piece of the black and white challenge fabric. No limits on additional fabrics and colors. Go for it! (red – from our title pun- is optional)

#### **Size and Construction:**

1. Maximum size of entry: 40"x 40"

2. Must be a quilt- no bags, totes, pillows, etc.

3. Any construction techniques and embellishments allowed as long as your word is sewn in some way.

4. Item must be quilted and finished.

# **Children's Emergency Fund Project**

Some children in foster care are fortunate to be placed with families who are able to provide generously at Christmas time. But it was apparent that other children were left out during the holidays. The Omaha Quilters' Guild became aware of the need and in 1992, created the Children's Emergency Fund. Originally, the project focused on sewing Christmas stockings but has since grown into a multifaced, annual event. There are four ways for members to participate in the project.

**Stocking Challenge:** At our September meeting, members line up to get their \$2.00 kit for the stocking challenge. All the completed stockings are then displayed, at our December Banquet where members vote on the stockings by monetary donation. A small prize is given for the 24 stockings that raise the most money. All the stockings

and the monies raised are donated to Child Protective Services (CPS) Angel Bags: An empty stocking isn't much fun, so we ask the members for

donations of stocking stuffers. This part of the project is referred to as the Angel Bag Project. Members pick up a bag at the November meeting, and then they put new, unwrapped gifts in the bag and return it to the December meeting. CPS caseworkers select stockings and stuffers which they then deliver to children who are in foster care, shelters, or hospitals.

*Santa's Workshop:* Members make and donate items to be raffled, and those are raffled at the December Banquet.

Thanks to generous members, we usually have over 150 items!



*Caring Friends Auction:* We also have a project created specifically for members to work together. This part of the fund-raiser is

## OQG Board Meeting Minutes Tuesday, July 28, 2009

A discussion was held to amend the Bylaws of the Omaha Quilters' Guild as follows:

The current bylaw, Article VIII, third paragraph. reads:

Article VIII - Dues of Committees

The Standing Committees can only be dissolved by the

Executive Committee, and shall consist of the following committees: Quilt Show, Newsletter, Membership, Historian and Education/ Speaker's Bureau.

Proposed bylaw <u>changes</u> to Article VIII, are a spelling correction to the heading and the removal of the Education/Speaker's Bureau from the third paragraph. The proposed Bylaw will read:

Article VIII - <u>Duties</u> of Committees

The Standing Committees can only be dissolved by the Executive Committee, and shall consist of the following committees: Quilt Show, Newsletter, Membership, and Historian. The need for this Standing Committee change was discussed by the Executive Board.

The Education/Speaker's Bureau has been inactive for several years. Any former duties of this committee will be addressed by the Community Connection/ Education committee in the future.

# **Modern Quilters**

This month starts a series of articles featuring members of OQG. Our new president Kathy Havranek sent 10 questions to long term members and current board members.

This month features our webmaster extraordinaire Roberta Willet.



#### How long have you been quilting?

I have always loved fabric (my first job was in the fabric de-

partment of our local JC Penny's store) but I made my first quilt in 1968 – TREE OF LIFE – from a cross-stitch kit. I used a high loft batt and a percale bed sheet for backing. I stab stitched in and out of every blue dot and blind hem stitched it all closed. I didn't make another quilt until 1988.

# Who or what inspired you to quilt?

Paulette Peters gave a slide show presentation at the Fremont Quilt Show displaying pictures of the US Bicentennial State Quilt winners. She spent time explaining the quilts and shared comments and thoughts she had about the quilts with me. I came away knowing that we both loved quilts and that if quilters were like her, I wanted to be one of them.

#### How long have you belonged to the Omaha Quilters Guild?

Betty Harmsen and I were already great friends when we discovered OQG. We joined in the spring of 1988 and attended the very first meeting at the new Westside Community Center site that fall.

# In what positions have you served?

I've served on the membership committee, chaired the Block Exchange, held the position of Corresponding Secretary, President Elect and President of OQG. In recent years, I've served as webmaster and been on call to all the committees for "duties as assigned".

# What was your first quilt and where is it now?

#### My first quilt – TREE OF LIFE

- has long since disintegrated. It was not a high quality fabric. It was white, sewed together with inexpensive white threat, used a lot. After a few years, it was loved to death.

#### What is your latest quilt and what are your plans for it when it is completed?

I wish I could say I had a "latest quilt"! I have three GIRLFRIEND quilts in process and it is my goal to have them entered in the 2010 OQG show. I was given blocks by friends for my 60<sup>th</sup> birthday and I've been working for couple of years on this project. I have a Bernina 440 now and hope to quilt them all myself.

#### What has quilting brought into your life that you did not expect?

Quilting has brought so much more into my life than I imagined possible. Close friends, life skills and the joy of the process. I don't much care what happens to my quilts once they are done. My kids frequently grab them or a friend who admires one might go home with it. It is the process and the closeness of other women that bring the joy.

# Where have you traveled to see quilts, see a show, or to buy fabric?

I have traveled with my husband to visit family in Michigan, Maryland, Virginia and Washington DC. We drive and he kindly stops now and again so I can visit a quilt shop. With my small group, Gone to Pieces, I have been as far south as Kansas City and all over western Iowa and eastern Nebraska. I haven't shopped any farther west than Grand Island except for a couple of business trips to California and Arizona. My goal is to have enough fabric to last the rest of my life and I'm probably close.

# What is your proudest quilting accomplishment?

I don't have one proudest accomplishment or quilt. Each time I perform a quilting skill – piecing or pressing or appliqué – I try to do it the very best way I can. At the end of a task if I feel I've done well, I experience great satisfaction. Believe it or not, those moments don't come all that often for me. I've seen some marvelous work over the years and it's tough not to compare my work with the perfection I've seen. I'm always striving to be better.

# Do you have any personal comments?

If people just realized that the more they put into the Guild, the more they get out of it, we would never have a shortage of volunteers. We all need to give back some of the good fortune we've received and I can't think of a better organization to accomplish that goal.


the setting strips.
