### **Block Exchange**



## Labeling Your Quilt Show Entry

Every item entered in the quilt show MUST have an entry label placed on the lower left of the back side of the quilt. The label should be a piece of fabric, and with a permanent marking pen include the following information: Quilts Show Entry Number, Name, Address, Phone number. Sew this label on with a whip stitch. Please do NOT use tape or safety pins! If you are having the quilt judged, your name, address, and phone number must be covered – ONLY the entry number can show.

You may either whip stitch a piece of fabric over the personal info, or place masking tape over it. I personally like to use a piece of fabric approximately 6 inches by 9 to 12 inches. I write the entry number at the top and my name, address and phone number at the bottom. Then I fold it in thirds, with the top third showing the number over the bottom third that has the personal info and then stitch it on. For example:

## **Modern Quilter**

This month's modern quilter is our Treasurer Terri Caffrey.



How long have you been quilting? I've been quilting since 1990. I took the Patchwork Possibilities class at the Log Cabin Quilt Shop for beginning quilters. Patty Kennedy was my first teacher, and she got me really hooked on

#### it.

Who or what inspired you to quilt? My Grandmothers were my inspiration to quilt. My Dad's Mom was always quilting--she was a founding member of the quilting bee at our church, and as long as I can remember had her sewing machine set up in the living room and some piecework going on. I never saw it messy and know I couldn't be that tidy. She made a quilt for all her children and several for the first great-grandchild in each family (my daughter has one) until her eyesight gave out on her sometime in the

1980's. My Mom's Mom died when I was in High School and, while she could sew anything, I always thought of her as a wannabe quilter since what my Mom inherited were quilt patterns and fabrics. At a family reunion I found out she had made some quilts too, that others in the family had gotten. I did get one of the quilts sewn from the stash my Mom got--the light yellow to orange Lone Star.

How long have you belonged to the Omaha Quilters Guild? I think I joined OQG in the fall of 1990, again at Patty's urging.

In what positions have you served? I've been the Opportunity Quilt maker once, and Opportunity Quilt piecer once. Now I'm Guild Treasurer.

What was your first quilt and where is it now? My first quilt is the Patchwork Possibilities quilt and it is still in my possession--fun to look at to see how far I've come, but oh those colors....
