

Quilt Safari



The pages seem to be flying off the calendar and before you know it, we'll be turning the page to June. I hope you're using your quiet winter months indoors to create some beautiful masterpieces to enter in the show.

If you're looking for a way to get more involved in the Omaha Quilters Guild, please volunteer to chair a committee of the quilt show. We have a lot positions to fill and a lot of work to be done. Please contact Jan Fry, Betty Harmsen or Karen Eveans today to volunteer. And for those who prefer to be worker bees instead of leaders, we have plenty of work that needs to be done. If you think that you will be unable to work a

shift at the show to cover your commitment for your entries (2 hours for each entry in the show), now is the time to contact one of the chairmen about helping with ribbons or other behind the scenes work.

The show team and the judging coordinator have talked through the copyright issues that came up in guilds all around the country this fall in light of a magazine article on the subject. We are confident that our entry form does the most that can be done to protect all parties. Your part of the job is to give credit where credit is due. When you're writing up your descriptions, please give the source of your pattern. The viewing public often wants to know how they can make a quilt just like the one they've seen. Having the pattern in the description gives them a source with which to begin their search. But citing the source is important in the judging process as well. The information you provide

is read to the judge if there is a question that comes up during the judging. Give as detailed information as you possibly can-the designer's name, the book that it is featured in or the name of the pattern. And if you designed the quilt yourself, by all means, take the credit!

One of the most important changes that we've made to the entry form concerns categories. This year there has been an addition of a category for quilts from kits. Very few of us make entirely original quilts; we all rely on commercially available patterns to some extent. In recent years however, there has been a growing trend to "kit" patterns with pre-selected fabrics. We all love them, we all buy them. But the truth of the matter is that we don't deserve as much credit for entire quilting process when we make a kit quilt as we do when we design the quilt ourselves and make all the fabric and design selections on our own. When we make a quilt

from a kit, the color placement and fabric selections have been made for us and we really should only be judged on the execution of the pattern. How technically perfect was the piece that we made from this kit? Hence the need for a category that covers these types of quilts. Quilts entered in this category are not eligible for Best of Show because that award is intended to represent the highest levels of both design and execution. There are plenty of other ribbon options available for exceptionally well made quilts in this category.

Please try to fill out your entry forms and submit them electronically. You are doing the show team a great favor in doing them this way.

We will have some updates and announcements to share at the February meeting, with details to follow in next month's newsletter.




