Here are the major requirements of the 2012 challenge:

- 1. Make an album cover based on a favorite song from the late 60's (66, 67, 68, 69, or 70)
- 12" X 12"

3. Must have an altered fabric on the front of the quilt and a piece of the unaltered

- 4. Put the name of the song, the artist and the year the song was released on the back of the quilt
- 5. There must be a peace symbol on the front of your quilt
- 6. There must be at least one bead on the front of your quilt

- 8. The piece must be quilted and bound.
- 9. Please include a brief statement about your challenge piece in your entry.


