See You in September ...

The OQG is proud to host Jane Hall as our September Program and Class Instructor.

Ms. Hall has lectured and taught quiltmaking for guilds and quilt conferences in the United States and abroad for twenty-five years. She is an author and quilt designer as well as a teacher, judge, and appraiser for antique and contemporary quilts.

Her award-winning quilts have been exhibited nationally and internationally in quilt shows, juried fiber and multi-media exhibitions, and galleries. Her quilts are included in public and private collections and in the American Quilter's Society Museum in Paducah, KY.

She has a particular interest in foundation work, and has explored methods for using foundation techniques in all kinds of piecing, traditional, innovative, as well as designs not usually considered for foundation piecing.

Jane is intrigued by the interaction of colors in fabrics and the graphics of quilt designs, especially the geometry of patterns such as Mariner's Compasses, Log Cabins and Pineapples. She works most often with traditional patterns using innovative sets and coloration, taking a fresh approach to the designs. The Chroma series of Pineapple colorwash designs is among her most recent work.

A complete overview of all the ways you can design and piece borders to frame your quilts uniquely. Specific design categories and techniques are covered in detail, working from very simple to pretty complex pieced borders, all of which will frame and enhance your work incredibly.



"I consider a foundation to be anything you piece ON or WITH, which opens the genre to include almost any pattern you choose to piece. (I even use foundations for Strip Piecing, to keep those long lines straight.) Pineapples Plus

This graphic design has so many possibilities, it is hard to know where to start, but we do begin at the beginning with one classic Pineapple block, pieced on a vellum foundation.

The pattern has been computergenerated, and is accurate and easy to see and sew on. Sewing with strips, upside-down or on the back of the pattern, may be new to some, so everyone makes one practice block. Then on to whatever design you fancy.

The choices are two kinds of offcenter patterns, a Flying Geese pattern, or playing with the classic block to create new designs.

Pineapples are so versatile, there is always one more just waiting to be made, and it's my hope that you will become enamored of them too.

Sliced Steps

When Whitehouse Steps Log Cabin blocks are cut apart at the same angles for each block, and the segments then recombined, a wonderful mélange of colors and shapes appears. The classic pattern morphs into an entirely new graphic with unpredictable shapes, highlights, even transparencies.

Since this requires a minimum of 16 blocks, better yet 20 or 25, we'll spend some time designing with paper patterns, and then start making blocks with fabrics. This is a great way to use your stash of strips and scraps!

The Quilting Bee says ...

Stitch faster when hand quilting
by pulling the thread through in the same
direction as your quilting stitches. Your thread
will be less likely to knot or tangle.

BLOCK EXCHANGE

So this year we are going red, white, and blue. So beg, borrow, and steal (well, don't steal) from your stash, friends, or small groups all of your patriotic colors. Get ready for some challenging blocks. The first of this season is a Crazy Patch. Follow the instructions and join in the fun.

Crazy Patch Pattern for September 2012



You will need an assortment of red, white, blue pieces. 1- Foundation piece of muslin or scrap of fabric, 13" square.

Let's start-----

Make an uneven five sided piece of fabric any color, about 4 inches across. Place this piece on your foundation right side up, lay another color fabric on top of this wrong side up, and sew a seam. Flip and press. Trim off any extra fabric. Do not cut foundation fabric.

Using your favorite fancy stitches on your machine (zigzag, flowers, and satin stitches) cover your seams. Add another strip to the adjacent side, flip and press. Cover your seams with a different stitch or the same stitch.

Continue in this manner until you have covered the entire foundation piece. Trim to 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.


There is still availability for Camp Wannamakeablankie at Camp Carol Joy Hollings Friday Oct 19 - Sunday Oct. 21.


If you want to be kept up to date but do not have email or you might want to help sell the tickets at other locations during the year - write me a note and drop it in the ticket box.

2012 Byron and Sara Rhodes Dillow Excellence Fund Public Lecture: "Mark My Words" by Julie Silber

Nearly from the start, some quilt makers have incorporated the written word into their work. Illustrating with slides and textile examples, Julie will discuss a fascinating range of motives, techniques, and messages in quilts made as early as 1800 – and as recently as the day before yesterday.

Julie Silber is a respected quilt expert who has been selling antique quilts to museums, businesses, and individuals since 1968. Julie was the curator of the Esprit Quilt Collection in San Francisco and is the co-author of the critically acclaimed books, Hearts and Hands (Nelson, 2000) and Amish: The Art of the Quilt(Knopf, 1990).

2013 Symposium Quilts in Context: The Making of Meaning, April 26-27, 2013

This symposium will focus on the various

contexts inhabited by quilts and how those contexts shape and alter quilts' meanings. The keynote speakers will address quilts, domestic interiors and dress in a variety of contexts.:

- · domestic interiors, decorative, furnishings, and architectural contexts;
- relationships between quilts and fashion/style that situate them within shared material contexts;
- appearance in photos, print, advertising that show real or imagined contexts made possible by technology;
- · and non-domestic, new, or emerging contexts within human-made places—such as museum, galleries, and fairs—in which quilts appear as art or alongside other art/craft/artifacts.

Invited speakers include Lynne Bassett, Linda Eaton, and Joan Severa, plus guest exhibition curator Janet Finley. Online reservation will be available October 1, 2012. Space will be limited.

Tuesday, July 24, Noon Talk by Curator of Collections, Dr. Carolyn Ducey, "Planning and Designing the Exhibition Studio Art Quilt Associates Showcase"

This invitational exhibition sponsored by the IQSCM in partnership with the Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA) opens August 3rd. It features selections by 4 to 6 juried artists who demonstrate innovation in the

contemporary art quilt form. Through their works, some of which have been created specifically for this exhibition, the artists explore and express aesthetic concerns common to the whole range of visual arts, while maintaining a clear relationship to the folk art from which contemporary quiltmaking descends.
