The second is the creative challenge of designing from a full-scale perspective and then sewing in a smaller scale. She is the author of SMALL SCALE QUILTING.

I didn't have samples of her work to share at the May meeting, but she has sent me information and photos of the class projects that will be on the OQG Web Page soon and are on bulletin boards at the local quilt shops. She will present a "Trunk Show" with real quilts at the meeting on September 14, 2004. Her first workshop will be on Sunday, September 12 from 9 am-4 pm on "Small Pieced Baskets" This class will stress precision sewing and is for all levels. On Monday, September 13, 2004 from 9 am - 4 pm, she will offer a workshop on "Framed Dou-

for all levels and uses four patches and some hand appliqué to develop the design. She tells me it is very easy and makes a beautiful gift. The cost for each of the classes will be \$20 for members and \$30 for nonmembers of the guild and will be held at Country Inns and Suites

For the October meeting we have invited JoAnn Belling from Des Moines, Iowa to be with us. She had a wonderful prize winning guilt entered in the River City Roundup Quilt Stampede last year and has two quilts entered this year. She will be teaching two wonderful workshops for us. On Monday, October 11 she will teach "Japanese Colorwash Fan" from 9am - 4 pm. A change for our guild will be a class offered on Wednesday, October 13 from 1 -7 pm, the day after the guild meeting. Her workshop will be on her prize winning quilt, "Snippets in Design". We need to have members start to save snippets of fabric they might otherwise throw away and bring to guild in September for use in the class. Photos for both of the workshops will also be on the OQG Web Page. You may also want to go to her website: www.joannbelling.com to look at the project and read more about her. I will have have samples to show at the first meeting of the year. Both of her classes will be held at the Regency Park Inn on Pacific. Barb will be in charge of registration for JoAnn's classes. Each of her workshops will be \$20 for member and \$30 for non-members.

The "Japanese Colorwash Fan" quilt is a workshop to use and grade colorwash fabrics. The (See New Quilting Yr page 2)

circle wedge ruler. Various methods to appliqué the fans to the background will be discussed. You may want to add embellishments, piping and quilting to complete your art piece. A fun class to let your imagination run wild.

She suggests that you use the kits she will have available for the workshop for \$45 each. They will include the 9 degree ruler you need to make the project. They MUST be ordered from JoAnn at least 1 week before the workshop at her email address tbelling@aol.com. She will also have plastic rulers available for class members for \$1. You do not need to order these in advance.

For the Wednesday class you will need to bring a drawing, photo, or greeting card of a picture you would like to make. She will show you how to add the fabrics and embellishments you have selected to complete your project You do not need to be able to machine quilt to complete this project. It is another opportunity for you to let your imagination take control and produce a work of art the size and theme you desire.

Our own Nancy Peters will be our quest in November. She will teach two workshops for us. One is her "Coral Reef" on Sunday, November 7, from 1 - 7 pm. Members will have the chance to enroll in "Fun With Embellishments" on Monday, November 8 from 1 - 4 pm. She will have samples to share with us and tell us all about the projects at the September meeting. The "Coral Reef" will have a kit available for purchase from Nancy along with your other supply information.

#### ROW, ROW, ROW YOUR QUILT Block Exchange October 2004 Row of Two Patches / Two Color Quilt Block


October's block is the Streak of Lightening made of half square triangles (two patches). This is going to be a scrappy block in medium to dark blues and whites. If you use four different blues and four different whites, you can actually make two blocks very easily.

#### CUT:

- 4- 5 7/8 inch squares, cut each square diagonally. Use four different medium to dark blue fabrics.
- $\,$  4-  $\,$  5 7/8 inch squares, cut each square diagonally. Use four different white fabrics. Do NOT use cream or off white.

#### SEW:

- 1. Sew a blue half square triangle to a white half square triangle. Mix and match all the blues and whites.
- 2. Sew four of the blue/white squares together, following the diagram below.

ROW, ROW, ROW YOUR QUILT Block Exchange October 2004 Row of Two Patches / Two Color Quilt Block

October's block is the Streak of Lightening made of half square triangles (two patches).


This is going to be a scrappy block in medium to dark blues and whites. If you use four different blues and four different whites, you can actually make two blocks very easily.

#### CUT:

- 4- 5 7/8 inch squares, cut each square diagonally. Use four different medium to dark blue fabrics.
- 4- 5 7/8 inch squares, cut each square diagonally. Use four different white fabrics. Do NOT use cream or off white.

#### SEW:

- 1. Sew a blue half square triangle to a white half square triangle. Mix and match all the blues and whites.
- 2. Sew four of the blue/white squares together, following the diagram below.




#### ROW, ROW, ROW YOUR QUILT Block Exchange November 2004 Row of Three Patches

The Flying Geese Block will be composed of a row of four "geese". This will be a scrappy block. CUT:

- 4 Rectangles 4½ x 2½ inches. Use four different fabrics, one for each of the four geese.
- 8 2½ inch squares. Cut two squares each of four different cream or off white fabrics for the backgrounds

#### SEW:

- 1. Draw diagonal lines on the backs of all of the background squares.
- 2. Place one background square (right sides together) against the right side of one of the "goose" rectangles. The diagonal line should run from the right corner to the middle of the rectangle.
- 3. Sew on the diagonal line.
- 4. Flip and press the background square back. (I like to trim out the excess background square, but leave the excess of the "goose" fabric.
- 5. Place the second background square (right sides together) against the left side of the goose. The diagonal line should run from the left corner to the middle.
- 6. Flip and press the background square back.
- 7.Sew the individual "goose" units together: Flip the bottom "goose" (right sides together) onto the "goose" right above it. At the point of the bottom "goose" you will observe the 'X' of the crossed seams. Sew along this edge, making sure you cross through the center of that 'X'. Continue to sew the individual 'goose' units together in this manner.

### Children's Emergency Fund

For the people new to the quild or those who really aren't sure what our Children's Emergency Fund is all about, I want you to know what I know.

Fourteen years ago, a member of our guild, Pat Sears, discovered a need in our community that wasn't being met and the idea for our annual fundraiser was born.

It is a sad reality that children are routinely removed from their homes due to abuse or neglect. A lot of them come to Social Services with the clothes on their backs and nothing more. During the Christmas Holidays their physical needs are met but quite frequently they come into the system too late to benefit from Toys for Tots or other similar campaigns. Not being "home" is sad enough without having to worry about Santa finding you.

We make stockings to give to the children so every child knows Santa has found them. We have Angel Bags that quilters can take and fill with gifts appropriate for a child of a certain age and sex. We donate and buy tickets to a miniraffle and collect money on the stockings we make. Our Guild groups make and donate items to the Caring Friends Auction held at the December meeting. All of this is great fun for us and fills an emotional and financial need that is hard to express.

Every dollar that we collect, every stocking we make, every Angel Bag that is filled is taken to Nebraska Health and Huthe December meeting. A "Stocking Store" is established and the distribution designed to Omaha Quilters' Guild and make every child have a Happy Holiday begins. 
#### ROW, ROW, ROW YOUR QUILT Block Exchange November 2004 Row of Three Patches

The Flying Geese Block will be composed of a row of four "geese". This will be a scrappy block. CUT:

- 4 Rectangles 4 ½ x 2 ½ inches. Use four different fabrics, one for each of the four geese.
- 8 2½ inch squares. Cut two squares each of four different cream or off white fabrics for the backgrounds

#### SEW:

- 1. Draw diagonal lines on the backs of all of the background squares.
- 2. Place one background square (right sides together) against the right side of one of the "goose" rectangles. The diagonal line should run from the right corner to the middle of the rectangle.
- 3. Sew on the diagonal line.
- 4. Flip and press the background square back. (I like to trim out the excess background square, but leave the excess of the "goose" fabric.
- 5. Place the second background square (right sides together) against the left side of the goose. The diagonal line should run from the left corner to the middle.
- 6. Flip and press the background square back.
- 7.Sew the individual "goose" units together: Flip the bottom "goose" (right sides together) onto the "goose" right above it. At the point of the bottom "goose" you will observe the 'X' of the crossed seams. Sew along this edge, making sure you cross through the center of that 'X'. Continue to sew the individual 'goose' units together in this manner.

# ROW, ROW, ROW YOUR: QUILT Block Exchange – January 2005 Row of Four Patches

#### CUT:

 $8-2\frac{1}{2}$  inch squares. Use eight different fabrics, we want a scrappy look.

1 – 7 inch square of a cream or off white fabric. Cut this square diagonally, both ways to get four triangles. The outside edges of the square (straight of grain) will become the long end of the triangle, which become the side of the long row.

#### SEW:

Assemble the four patch units.


Sew one triangle to one end of a four patch unit.

The right angle of the triangle will match up to the four patch unit.

Sew another triangle to the opposite side of the four patch unit.

The second triangle should be placed opposite of the first. See diagram. The two triangles and the four patch unit form a parallelogram.

Assemble the second parallelogram. Sew the two units together – see diagram.
