Overview

Omaha Quilters Guild is a group with over 200 members and is dedicated to the appreciation and preservation of quilts and the perpetuation of the art and the craft of quilt making through education and participation. Our guild looks for ways to contribute to the community through volunteering our supplies, skills and time.

Programs

We have several programs that impact our community. Specifically, Helping Hands is known to deliver groups of quilts to agencies for distribution to newborns and people in need. Recently, Helping Hands supplied 3 quilts to a mother, father, and 2 young boys who were sleeping in their jackets because they didn't have enough blankets to keep warm at night. This committee, with their good deeds, has to be the "heart" of our guild. Other organizations helped by Helping Hands include the Ronald McDonald House, Children's Hospital, Youth Emergency Services (YES), the Boystown Project, Hospice Project, Quilts of Valor and Quilts for all veterans in our community, ConKerr Cancer has a mission to brighten the lives of sick children in hospitals through homemade pillowcases. We make Fidget Quilts for Alzheimer's, ADD or on the autism spectrum. We've made weighted blankets to provide comfort and that "warm hug" to those in need. At Christmas time we support Children's Emergency Funds, providing gifts and funds to children coming in or out of foster care. And our members are presently trying to help protect our healthcare workers by making masks and repairing hospital scrubs and gowns during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Here is a nomination of one of our unsung heroes: Jambo!!

Mary Mayfield has been promoting quilting and encouraging women to celebrate the work of their hands in both Nebraska and in East Africa.

Mary led her 11th Annual Tanzanian Fabric, Fun, and Facts Benefit Retreat in February 2020 at Camp Carol Joy Holling. The featured quilt was the African Ladies. Mary prepared kits using Tanzanian fabric that made either a wall hanging, a baby quilt, a throw, or a bed sized quilt.

Mary's retreats offer a glimpse into Tanzanian culture, including wrapping campers in Kangas, jewelry and colorful head wear while learning a few new words.

During the retreat, participants learn about programs in the Mt Kilimanjaro area like Houses for Health, Mosaic International, Building Caring Communities, and scholarship funds. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania is a sister synod of the Nebraska Synod (ELCA).

Through this partnership, Mary has traveled to Tanzania seven times.

Mary's mission to teach, encourage, and empower women to support their families in Africa through the art of quilting will give generations of Tanzanian women joy, dignity and pride in accomplishment while they mentor more women to do the same.

Six scholarships to the Angaza Women's Training Center were provided in 2019! Here at home, Mary is the founder of Sewing for Babies Omaha. A non profit begun in 2004 which provides layettes for local mothers in need.

Mary and her volunteers meet twice a month at St. Matthews Lutheran Church and work to create 26 items to be presented to mothers with at risk newborns in local hospital NICUs. These include newborn outfits from hats to socks, washcloths burp cloths as well as quilts. Items are designed, assembled and delivered by her amazing team.

Mary has served as a teacher, vendor and friend to many guilds and individuals. With great admiration we celebrate and recognize her dedication in sharing her quilting knowledge and gifts for so many years.
