There is also time to be part of this if you are entering quilts in the Cottonwood Show. The Threads show is the 2-day state guilt show and has classes and vendors.

The <u>Papillion Historical Society</u> is having a quilt show and is requesting quilts made from 1950-2000 to be displayed. These quilts will not be judged but they want the story of the quilt to be included. There will be a white elephant sale with proceeds going to the Historical Society.

Janelle Reed presented the <u>Mystery Quilt</u> for the year. It will be a table runner size made with 5 fabrics. All details will be out in October. She needs your name and email for the directions.

Molly Phillips showed us the fabric she has chosen for this year's stocking Challenge. The fat quarters will be \$3 each. The completed stockings need to be turned in by the November meeting. All proceeds from the votes on the stockings go to the Children's Emergency Fund.

Kerby Selmer said that sewing sessions for <u>Quilts for Veterans</u> are starting up again; they meet at Fabric Bash on the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of the month from 9-3.

The quilt can be made with different colors that gives it more versatility. The class is designed to teach about color values. Supply lists will be online soon.

Barb Trochim from the <u>Library</u> announced 2 new books for loan as well as the book on Panel quilts by our guest speaker.

Angie Reed of <u>Helping Hands</u>— Next month's meeting will a sew-in. There will be projects to make duvet covers for the homeless and pillowcases for those who need to move unexpectedly. The sew-in starts at 5 PM at the September meeting. There is plenty to do for quilters of all skill levels.

Melissa Peters of <u>Membership</u>, passed out door prizes, some of which were donated by our quilt show vendors, to the lucky ticket holders. There were 109 members present tonight.
