

QUILT SHOW ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS

Please read carefully before completing entry form. A separate form must be completed for each item entered. PLEASE PRINT all information. Make additional copies of the entry form as required. Complete entry forms must be received by the quilt show committee no later than April 30, 2024. DO NOT TURN IN QUILTS AT THIS TIME.

DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES IS APRIL 30, 2024 AND WILL NOT BE EXTENDED.

General Information

- Entrant must be a paid member of the Omaha Quilters Guild.
- All entries must be clean, constructed of fabric and be quilted.
- All entries must be completed within the last 5 years.
- Entries may be evaluated, at the entrant's request, by a National Association of Certified Quilt Judges (NACQJ) certified judge.
- A MAXIMUM of 10 items may be entered for exhibition; a MAXIMUM of 3 of the 10 items may be judged. The challenge quilts do not count as one of the 3 judged entries unless you also indicated that you want this item judged by the NACQJ judge.
- Quilts must be clean, smoke and odor free. We reserve the right not to exhibit quilts that do not meet these standards. If an item is judged, entrant will receive a written evaluation form after the close of the show. Ribbon awards are given at the discretion of the judge. The decision of the judge is final.
- Fill in the name of the quilter, even if you quilted your own project.
- Items which have been exhibited or judged in a previous Omaha Quilters Guild show may not be entered. All entries to be JUDGED must be the work of the entrant, EXCEPT in the case of professionally quilted quilts.
- Items which are not the work of the entrant may be for exhibit only.
- The judge reserves the right to disqualify any item not meeting published criteria. No special hanging or handling will be allowed.

STEP 1: SIZE/CATEGORY – SELECT ONE

Bed Quilt: Quilt intended for use on a bed. The minimum size is 60" wide by 72" long.

Wall Hanging/Throw: Quilt intended for wall display or use as a throw.

Crib/Baby: Quilt intended for use by a baby or child.

Miniature: A scaled version of a large quilt. Must be reduced in scale. Quilts must measure 24" or smaller per side.

Pieced: Entry contains primarily hand or machine piecing. Small amount of other techniques permitted.

Appliquéd: Entry contains primarily hand or machine appliquéd. Small amount of other techniques permitted.

Mixed: Entry is constructed using a substantial amount of two or more techniques, such as appliquéd and piecing. The technique does not include quilting or trapunto. Please describe the technique.

Innovative Art: A unique and/or original design (any size) not made from a pattern.

Modern: Including, but not limited to, bold colors, prints, solids, contrast, improvisation, negative space, alternate grid work, inspired by Modern Design.

Group Quilt: The entry is made by two or more people. Entry must be entered under the name of the owner OR the name of the individual in charge of the project. This category does not include professional (for hire) quilted quilts. A group name may be entered as the maker.

Other: Entry is constructed using one special technique such as whole cloth, stenciled, crazy quilt, embroidered, etc. Table toppers/runners, tree skirts, totes, and quilted clothing are included in this category. Please describe the item and technique used in the appropriate space on the entry form.

STEP 2: QUILTING - SELECT ONE

Hand Quilted: Must be quilted entirely by hand.

Domestic: Quilting was done on a table-top sewing machine where the machine is stationary and the quilt is moved.

Longarm Edge-to-edge: Quilting is an all over design done on a longarm quilting machine. (pantograph or free motion).

Longarm Custom: Quilting was done on a longarm machine with different quilting designs in various areas of the quilt.

Longarm Computerized: Quilting was done on a longarm machine guided by a computer.

* Professional, for hire, means you paid for the quilting.

STEP 3: ADDITIONAL CATEGORIES – SELECT ALL THAT APPLY

First Quilt Show Entry: First quilt show entry by the maker in any show.

Holiday Theme: Entry represents holiday theme (Halloween, Christmas, etc.)

Scrap Quilt: Must contain a minimum of 35 different fabrics, excluding backing fabric.

2024 Challenge: The 2024 Challenge entry follows the challenge rules as defined.

OQG Mystery Quilt: Any quilt made from the OQG Mystery Quilt project.

Past OQG Class Quilt: Any quilt made in an OQG class. Cite year and teacher in description. Must be completed within the last five years.

Junior Quilt: Entry made almost entirely by a youth aged 18 years old or younger, with some assistance by an OQG member.

ALL ENTRIES WILL BE EXHIBITED AND/OR JUDGED BY CATEGORY. EACH ENTRY CAN BE ENTERED IN ONLY ONE CATEGORY. QUILT SHOW CHAIRMAN RESERVES THE RIGHT TO MOVE ENTRIES TO A MORE APPROPRIATE CATEGORY FOR JUDGING.
